

Diploma Policy of the Faculty of Global Human Sciences

Kobe University's Faculty of Global Human Sciences aims to produce 'cooperative global graduates' who can tackle global issues (the issues facing today's society that need to be addressed through cooperation on a global scale) with a deep sense of empathy and compassion towards other people, in addition to being able to contribute towards building a global society where people across the world can coexist beyond borders.

The faculty aims to achieve these objectives by awarding bachelor's degrees according to the following policy.

o Degree: Bachelor of Arts

• Department of Global Cultures

The Department of Global Cultures in the Faculty of Global Human Sciences awards degrees in global cultures as follows, based on the Kobe University Diploma Policy.

- Students shall study at the faculty for a period of four years or more, and must obtain the prescribed credits required to complete the course.
- Prior to graduating, students are expected to acquire the following skills in addition to the abilities set out in the Kobe University Diploma Policy.
 - The ability to pose questions on global issues in a critical and logical manner.
 - A broad range of communication, information-gathering and analytical skills which make effective use of foreign languages and ICT.
 - The ability to understand global issues from the perspective of cultural diversity.
 - The ability to cooperate with others and display leadership with the aim of tackling global issues.
 - A broad knowledge of and expertise in global cultural formation, global social dynamics, and global communication.

• Department of Human Development and Community

The Department of Human Development and Community in the Faculty of Global Human Sciences awards degrees in human development and community as follows, based on the Kobe University Diploma Policy.

- Students shall study at the faculty for a period of four years or more, and must obtain the prescribed credits required to complete the course.
